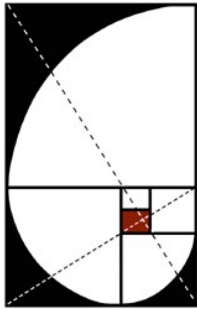

## SENIORS

Now that Seniors have their college applications under their belts, it is time to hit the scholarship search and to review financial aid awards as they arrive.

Encourage your child to read all instructions from colleges very carefully, making note of any deadlines that may be approaching. There is no need to rush a decision; applicants have until May 1 to make final decisions. If your child makes his or her final decision before May 1, it is a courtesy to notify all other schools to which he or she was accepted but will not be attending. As decisions arrive, encourage your child to keep Mrs. Cooper up-to-date via Naviance or sending an email.

## SENIOR CHECKLIST: FEBRUARY



**Check individual college portals** to receive admissions news. If admitted, colleges should also communicate where, when, & how to review your financial aid award letter.



**Ensure all financial aid documentation (FAFSA and/or the CSS Profile) is received** by the financial aid office for all colleges.



**Mid-year Grades are sent to colleges**



**Communicate** all admission & scholarship information & upcoming admission deadlines to Mrs. Cooper.



**Plan Spring Break College Visits** to the schools to which you have been accepted.



## JUNIORS

Junior Parent Night is scheduled for **Tuesday, February 6 at 6:30pm at school**. This evening is intended to introduce you to all facets of the college application process so that you can support your child as they begin this journey. Specific topics we will cover include a timeline of important events, understanding the admission process, the ins and outs of standardized testing, and an overview of financial aid and scholarships. While this is not a required event, all parents of juniors are strongly encouraged to attend.

Juniors have had time in the computer lab during the school day to research colleges and ask Mrs. Cooper questions. This time is intended to supplement, not replace the time spent researching colleges outside of school. Each Junior will have an individual College Conference with the College Counselor after spring break. If you would like to be part of this conference, keep an eye out for a sign up sheet that will be emailed to you in the upcoming weeks.

## SAT and ACT reminder

All 11th graders will take the SAT at MacLaren on April 10th. If your child desires to take the **ACT** this semester, there is an **April 14** test date. The **registration deadline is March 9!** It is not too early to go ahead and register for this test.

As a reminder, all SAT and ACT tests have a \$46 test fee that must be paid at the time of registration. The April 10 SAT is the only exception; this is a State test, therefore, the test fee is covered by the state of Colorado.

## **SOPHOMORES**

This month Sophomores learned financial aid basics in their ICAP sessions. Using CU Boulder's cost of attendance as an example, they learned the effect that student debt will have on their lifestyle after college graduation. Ask them about the details of what they learned!



## **FRESHMEN**

All freshmen learned the importance of looking for college scholarships early and explored ways to find scholarships in their ICAP session this month. They also looked deeper into the careers they find interesting to see what education is required for different types of careers. Ask your child what they have learned about their careers of interest.
