



UNITED STATES MILITARY ACADEMIES

U.S. Naval Academy (Annapolis, MD)

The mission of the service academies is to provide the instruction and experience necessary to produce graduates with the knowledge, character, and leadership abilities to become career military officers. Attending one of the academies requires significant commitment, with a **five-year military obligation** as an officer in the respective service upon graduation.

To be eligible to attend an academy a student must:

- be 17 but not yet 23 years of age by July 1 of year admitted
- be a U.S. citizen at time of enrollment
- be single with no dependents
- Have an **above average** high school record, both in terms of GPA & the type of classes taken (college prep & **4 years of English, math and science**).
- Have strong scores on the SAT I or ACT (actual scores requirements vary with the different academies).
- Meet high leadership, physical, and medical standards
- Be of high moral character.

Competitive candidates are usually in the **top 10%** of their class; **on average** will have **SAT** scores around **669 Math, 642 Verbal**, and/or an **ACT composite of 30**. In general, **admissions are based 60% on academics and 40% on leadership and physical aptitude**.

Service Academy Admissions Process

1. To begin the application process, request a "Pre-candidate Questionnaire" from the academies during the **spring of your junior year**. Your candidacy begins with this form **so fill it out as completely as possible**. The academy will open a file for you upon receipt of the completed questionnaire. **Notify Mrs. Fruh when you have completed the pre-candidate questionnaire.**
2. Admission to any of the academies is gained through a unique system of nomination, evaluation, qualification and selection. A nomination is the legal authority for the academy to consider a candidate for admission. **APPLY for a nomination AFTER you have completed the pre-candidate questionnaire.** The nomination process will include an application, recommendations, and if you are minimally qualified, an interview. Visit the websites of our representatives **ASAP** to begin the nomination process. Two of our representatives require students to complete an online process and one requires students to request a nomination packet. There are **detailed instructions** and it is important that you follow them to the letter! Apply for a nomination from **ALL** of the following and return the completed forms **well before** the deadlines:
 - **the Vice-President: submit online between March 1st and January 31 at:**

NOMINATIONS ARE NOT REQUIRED FOR THE U.S. COAST GUARD ACADEMY.

3. Study the criteria for other nominating categories and apply if you are eligible. **Children of career members** of the U.S. military who are active, retired, or deceased may qualify for an appointment from the President; **children of Deceased/Disabled Veterans & children of POWs/MIAs and children of Medal of Honor Recipients** may apply for a nomination directly from the Director of Admissions of the academy.
4. Take the SAT and the ACT in the **spring of your junior year**. If needed, retake the tests during the senior year. The U.S.A.F.A. will use your **best composite score** while West Point and the Naval Academy will use your best subscores from multiple test dates. Currently, all require submitted scores to come from a national test date. **Be sure to either take the optional ACT Writing test or the optional SAT Essay test. Have your scores sent directly to the academies and our congressmen---**check the test booklets for their specific codes.
5. Identify the people you plan to use for references and ask them well in advance. Coordinate the completion of your **nomination packet with Mrs. Fruh so that all materials are mailed together well in advance of the various deadlines.**
6. If an evaluation of your Pre-candidate Questionnaire indicates that you meet the minimum qualifications for admission, a medical examination will be authorized. You will be scheduled for a medical exam by the DODMERB (Department of Defense Medical Examination Review Board). If possible, **schedule your appointment for late summer or early fall before you get busy with other senior demands.**
7. You will also receive a kit of **additional admissions forms and information and be scheduled for the candidate fitness test**, beginning in the early fall. You can work on your physical fitness level over the summer to help you achieve the highest results possible. Check with the academies to learn about their individual achievement standards. **You should request your medical exam and physical fitness test results be forwarded to ALL the academies. You will be given authorization cards to have the results sent to the officials that you have asked to nominate you.**
8. **Complete all application forms as soon as possible; coordinate mailing any application documents that aren't completed online with Mrs. Fruh so that any remaining "pieces" are mailed along with your transcript.**
9. Notification of an appointment may arrive as early as November for outstanding candidates. If you are informed of **any deficiencies** in your candidacy, you will have until **March 1** to improve upon your original application. Candidates are usually informed in early May if they will not be selected for an appointment.
